

## The Rag Bag Scheme



We have recently joined the Rag Bag Clothes Recycling Scheme, a national scheme for recycling unwanted clothing. We now have a collection point in school where you can drop off any clean, wearable clothing. Once the container is full, it is collected and we receive a small amount for school fundraising.

The bank will be open for drop off donations afternoons

#### on the first Wednesday of each month.

The 'Rag Bag' recycling scheme has been developed to provide regular fundraising for schools and nurseries in the UK.

The scheme increases awareness about textile recycling and by increasing recycling rates we can help the environment by ensuring less material goes to landfill.

The scheme is completely FREE, and school will be paid for every kg recycled. Together we can raise hundreds of pounds with every collection made!

### What textiles/ clothes can be recycled?

We <u>can</u> accept the following items:

- Wearable Clothing
- Paired Shoes
- Handbags
- Belts

We cannot accept the following items:

- Workwear
- Uniforms (including School Uniforms)
- Wet/Soiled Clothes
- Curtains
- Towels
- Duvets or Duvet Covers
- Pillows or Pillow Cases
- Blankets
- Table Cloths
- Linens
- Cushions
- Carpets
- Suitcases
- Books
- Bric a Brac
- Clothes Hangers
- Electricals

### Q: What happens to the clothes?

A: The clothing is graded at one of our four textile recycling facilities by Textile Recycling International Ltd. Over 1200 trained people are employed to sort and grade the materials prior to export around the world.
